2.14 Significant Activities and contributions made by IQAC

The task of IQAC is to ensure that every procedure in the institution for “education” is done efficiently and effectively with high standards. In order to do this, the IQAC will have to first establish these procedures and modalities to collect data and information on various aspects of institutional functioning. The coordinator of the IQAC will have a major role in implementing these functions. The IQAC may derive major support from the already existing units and mechanisms that contribute to the functions listed above. The operational features and functions discussed so far are broad-based to facilitate institutions towards academic excellence and institutions may adapt them to their specific needs.

The IQAC plays an active role in internalizing a culture of quality within the institution. This culture is maintained and sustained by several initiatives taken by the cell through the year. IQAC has to work continuously for collecting and collating qualitative & quantitative data from every unit of the University. Every Faculty and Department have formed internal quality cell for continuously updating information and supplying the same to IQAC at the central level. The quality cell at the departmental level shall ensure the internal quality of the department. In order to facilitate collection of information from various quarters the process should be fully automated and online. Orientation sessions shall be conducted for the faculty and periodical meetings/ discussions with department faculty representatives to collate the data pertaining to various activities of the departments. Performance appraisal of teachers is an important activity and IQAC shall be initiating the process soon. All the major committees of the university shall represent in the IQAC. The students’ wing should be the part of the meets, periodically, to plan activities which will enhance the quality of student life on campus. To study the working of the CBCS and the functioning of the IQAC, the university shall also coordinate with the members of IQAC of other institutions as well. Also through special

talks by eminent resource persons on accreditation and assessment would help the university IQAC to enhance the quality paradigm. Internal academic audit and setting up of Google Scholars Profile of teachers shall also be incorporated. The IQAC shall also be involved in preparing the reports and highlighting the activities of the university. Capacity building programmes shall be regularly organized for both teaching and non-teaching staff. The IQAC, through its activities, shall become an agent of change in the institution ensuring efficient performance of academic and administrative tasks.

- (i) Department of English has included Texts of Indian Knowledge Tradition in the syllabus of Research methodology.
- (ii) Department of History introduced a new subject "*Bharitya Gyan Parampra*" (Indian Knowledge Tradition) at under graduate level.
- (iii) In the Department of Human Consciousness and Yogic Science, innovative programmes of Diet Therapy and Yogic Life Style Modification Therapy, field training programs of Yoga/ Yoga therapy in schools, colleges, organizations & Community etc. were incorporated in the new curriculum of courses of MA/M.Sc. (two years programme), P.G. Diploma (one year programme), Certificate Course (one semester programme) and Elective Subject of Yoga in B.A.
- (iv) Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences has implemented the use of software in place of sacrificing animals in laboratories.
- (v) Faculty of Management Studies has implemented the syllabus based on the discussions with 16 top notch industries.
- (vi) Department of Environment Science KGC Haridwar has implemented Pest management, Biosystematics, Bio-diversity Aquatic Resources and their Management in M.Sc. course.
- (vii) Ved Department designed a *Paurihita* curriculum.

- (i) Vishwavidyalaya has received approval of two years M.P.Ed. course (four Semesters) from National Council for Teachers Education (NCTE) Jaipur vide their letter no. NRC/NCTE/UR-136/222 meeting/2013/68370 dated 13 Jan. 2014 but the N.O.C. is awaited from UGC till date.
- (ii) PG diploma courses in Adventurous Sports and in Health & Fitness each of one year duration and BA Course in Physical Education of three year duration (after 12<sup>th</sup> class) are under consideration by the Academic Council of Vishwavidyalaya.
- (iii) PG diploma course in Health and Fitness has also been approved by the Academic Council of Vishwavidyalaya.

2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning:

Departments of Veda, English & Physics, of main campus and Departments of Philosophy, History, Physics, Microbiology of KGC Haridwar & Departments of Management at KGC Dehradun, organized seminars and guest lectures for students.

Departments of Veda & English also adopted teaching of junior students by senior ones and review of texts by students.

Vedic Shodh Sansthan - a research department is using internet and computer for research.

Almost all the departments excepting one or two are using ICT for teaching like PPT on LCD projector and other audio-visual aids.

Department of Management Studies has developed a group on yahoo for online assignments for students who are advised to submit their solutions/ presentations on faculty e-mail. They also do teaching through business game, case lets and simulations.

Departments of English of KGC Haridwar uses examples from real life experience on Department of Philosophy of KGC Haridwar do teaching learning by A to Z process.

Department of Sanskrit of KGC Dehradun conducted campus for teaching / learning Sanskrit language and conversation. Department of English of KGC Dehradun are using assignment to students to enable better understanding.

#### **Practice – I**

##### **1. Title of the Practice**

Value based Inter-disciplinary Courses

##### **2. Objectives of the Practice**

Today the education system is defined in a highly commercialised technological sense, for being impregnated with target oriented attitude, for having mercenary approach in life and for focussing on epicurean philosophy. As a result society which was an institution, has crumbled down. Hence, now there is a demand of value education to strengthen the bond of society, to establish an interpersonal relationship, and to meet the global challenges. Undoubtedly the value education has become indispensable in the modern context where we are living like blind, melancholic individuals reposing our faith in fundamentalism, where there is no respect for fellow beings, no reverence for nature and no place for values. In this complex background, there is an urgent need to impart value education to the youth in the proper perspective especially based on the deep rooted Indian Vedic Value education system so that they are not misled. It is in this perspective that the Vishwavidyalaya has introduced the courses like Indian Aesthetics, Indian Knowledge Traditions, Dharma, Darshan Sanskriti, Vedic Maths, Vedic Management, Vedic Physics, performance of Daily Yajana that helps make you a better person socially, emotionally, psychologically, physically to face the global challenges.

##### **3. The context**

## Practice – II

### 1. Title of the Practice

Performing Daily Yajna

### 2. Objectives of the Practice

Today the society has crumbled down due to a highly commercialized technological attitude to life. We have forgotten the message of *lokasangraha* (Welfare of society) and the message of *idam namam* (non attachment). Hence, now there is a need of values to strengthen the bond of society, to establish an interpersonal relationship. We are socially, emotionally, psychologically, physically sick. In this complex background, there is an urgent need to practice a system which can sensitize our young generation to Society, Nature and Culture. It is in this perspective that the Vishwavidyalaya performs a daily Yajna that helps make a young student a better person socially, emotionally, psychologically, physically to face the global challenges.

### 3. The context

In spite of the fact that the whole globe has environmental problems, the young generation is insensitive to environmental governance. In Indian tradition, Yajna is a device to sensitize the young generation to Environmental matrix. The Vishwavidyalaya is practising daily “Yajna” since its inception. The challenge initially faced, was to inspire the students and the staff to join “Yajna” as the students and staff were from different backgrounds. But once they joined they came to know the advantages and the peace of mind which they achieved after performing “Yajna”.

### 4. Practising Yajna

Vedic Philosophy emphasized most on the protection of environment. Rigveda mentions that whatever we take from the environment we should compensate by paying back in some form. So practising “Yajna” has two fold benefits- one inculcating Vedic values among the students and the other compensating the environment to strengthen its properties beneficial for the health of all living beings.

## **5. Evidence of Success**

Students from all over the country take admission in the Vishwavidyalaya with varying behavioural aspects. Significant behavioural changes have been observed among the students. They changed positively with having better regards for social and national patriotic values. Special Yajna, performed to cure tuberculosis, and for antimicrobial effects have established that microbes, responsible for tuberculosis decrease in the vicinity where Yajna is performed. Also level of fungi in experimental area found decreasing. This demonstrates that performing Yajna cures diseases also.

## **6. Problems Encountered**

While conducting Yajna for specific purposes, making choice of “Samidhas” was a challenge for which Vedic literature was consulted and “Samidhas” of specific categories were chosen. Required proper infrastructure was also a problem.
