52. Future plans of the department.: Plan of Action of Department of Chemistry for the next five years

(a) CONSOLIDATION AND UPGRADATION OF EXISTING B.Sc. AND M.Sc. PROGRAMMES:-

The student strength has increased during last few years with about 994 students enrolled at B.Sc., M.Sc. and Ph.D. level currently.

Gurukul Kangri University, Haridwar is using its own funds for the construction of departmental library room, administrative block, equipments cabins, computer and networking laboratory, industrial testing laboratory and few research laboratories. However, the department, even 49 years after its establishment, has no conference room available for its activities. As stated earlier, department has organized 37th annual convention of chemists in the year 2000 and going to organize 27th Annual conference of Indian Council of Chemists in the end of the year 2008. Therefore, a reasonably big conference hall is urgently required as other councils and societies have already recognized the departmental caliber and capacity in terms of research work and the teaching skills (reflected by the fact that the department has started unique job oriented courses in the past).

Further no regular teaching staff has been appointed since2011 and there is an excess work load of 24 lecturers being shared by the regular staff members even after utilizing its own resources like inviting visiting faculties and appointing the ad-hoc teachers. Therefore vacant posts are required to be appointed immediately for which a request is being made.

Although the department is the proud owner of the facilities including costly equipments like GCMS, Stopped flow, Gas chromatograph, UV-VIS sopectrophotometer, and F.T.I.R. spectrometers and all computational and networking facilities, no technical officer, store keeper, library assistant, clerk, sweeper and peon have been appointed in the department although 46 years have passed after its establishment. Also, a shortage of at least 2 lab technicians, 02 lab assistants and 04 laboratory attendants is being felt since last 10 years. Therefore, 03 technical officer, 01 store keeper, 01 library

assistant, 01 clerk, 01 sweeper, 01 peon, 02 lab technicians, 02 lab assistants and 04 laboratory attendants are immediately required to be appointed for maintenance, handling and operating these and

Other equipments and saving these equipments from getting out of order even before their expected life.

Existing M.Sc. courses is job oriented and applied one with almost 100% absorption of pass puts in the industries in surrounding area as well as those situated far away eg. Oil and Natural Gas Commission, Indian Oil Corporation, Delhi State Excise Department, jgatjeet sing Industries, Archaeological Survey of India, Ranbaxy, Dabur, Haryana Leather Chemicals, Modi Vanaspati, Asian Paints, IDMA, Vam Organics, Terrent Pharma, Lupin, Amrit Vanaspati, Panacea Biotec, Luxar, DCM chemicals, Industrial testing labs, Soil Testing Labs, Leather, soap, Cement, Steel, Vegetable Ghee, Sugar, Distilleries etc. industries. This course requires further gradation of the instrumentation facilities up and instruments/equipments like H.P.L.C. apparatus, N.M.R. spectrometer and mass spectrometer, are urgently required in this regard. The grants for books, chemicals and furniture (for the laboratories being constructed by University) are also required for this up gradation. The old laboratories of the department need plastering, painting, change of shelves, termite treatment etc. Therefore funds are being requested for renovation of existing labs.

(b) CONSOLIDATION AND UP GRADATION OF EXISTING Ph.D. PROGRAMME/RESEARCH FACILITIES

This must be noted that no financial assistance has been provided by UGC for the research programmes since these were started in 1991-92.

All of the teaching faculty members are actively engaged in research programmes (in the field already mentioned), no separate research grant is being provided by university. Further grants for journals, books and research chemicals etc. are needed.

As stated earlier, department has organized 37th annual convention of chemists in the year 2000 and going to organize 27th Annual conference of Indian Council of Chemists in the end of the year 2008. Therefore, a reasonably big conference hall is urgently required as other council and societies have already recognized the departmental caliber and capacity in terms of research work and the teaching skills (reflected by the fact that the department has started unique job oriented courses in the past).

Further some financial assistance is also required for books, journals and general instrumentation.

(c) NEW RESEARCH ACTIVITIES PLANNED [RESEARCH PROFILE AND PLANS OF DEPARTMENT FOR THE NEXT FIVE YEARS]:

1. Discipline: Plant Chemistry and Ayurvedic Chemistry.

Keeping in view the urgent need to bio evaluate our plant wealth to replace the hazardous synthetic chemicals being used today in agricultural and medicinal products that have side effects by the plant based agrochemicals and medicinal products, majority of faculty members are involved in researches in the field of plant chemistry and Ayurvedic Chemistry. 02 research scholars are currently engaged in this work. 19 of the students have been awarded Ph.D. in this discipline from department to date. Dr. R. K. Shukla is currently involved in research in this field.

Fractionation and isolation of active principles of economically important plants especially from Uttaranchal hills by using the routine extraction methods and chromatographic separation methods like TLC, TLC-FID, GC, GC-MS, HPLC and their characterization by employing the techniques like element analysis, spectroscopic techniques (like UV-VIS, IR, H-NMR, C-13 NMR and Mass spectra) shall be continued to be undertaken during the next five years. The separated fractions in general and the separated compounds in particular shall be tested for their biocidal potential. This will add to the development of field of natural products as well as for protecting our national biodiversity and to solve our problems of crop protection and related diseases. Besides the continuation of this work, the studies related to the synergistic effect of different active principles and other chemical substances like metal complexes shall also be undertaken by the faculty members during the next 5 years. It is important to note that few plants have already been subjected to such studies and research publications/presentations have been made by the faculty. Some new compounds have also been reported and further work is in progress. This work shall be continued during next five years. The active components of Ayurvedic and folklore drugs need to be separated and characterized as well as tested for their medicinal importance by undertaking the studies related to the biopotentiation.

2. Discipline: Reaction Kinetics and Mechanism:

Major part of the job of chemist is the prediction and control of the chemical reactions. That s why, the kinetic-mechanistic studies gain significance from industrial, environmental and theoretical point of view. The hitherto unstudied Non-Malapradian oxidations of aromatic amines have been paid special attention in recent years. As a matter of fact, organic compounds are of great importance from physiological point of view. Hence study of their oxidation in presence of transition metals which are available in the human body itself, may be helpful for an understanding of various oxidation processes connected to the human physiology. Therefore, transition metal catalyzed periodate oxidation of physiologically important organic compounds may be used as model reactions for actual oxidations going on in the human systems.

This work is already in progress. 41 research students have already awarded Ph.D. degree in this discipline so far, 02 students are to submit Ph.D. thesis shortly, 06 more students are working in this field currently. Kinetic-mechanistic studies are being made spectrophotometrically. These studies are being coupled with the separation of intermediates and the main products of the reactions under consideration by employing the separation techniques like solvent extraction, crystallization, chromatography etc.

These products are identified and characterized by spectral studies (including the UV-VIS, IR, H-NMR, C13-NMR and Mass spectra), element analysis, functional group tests etc so as to confirm the mechanism. In this way, the work is not limited only to the routine kinetic studies and very well supported by identification of products etc. Furthermore, such studies are also helpful in preparation of producs of physiological and industrial importance. Currently one of the faculty member, Prof. R.D. Kaushik is actively engaged in this work. A good amount of work on kineticmechanistic studies on oxidation of organic compounds of physiological importance like aromatic amines (including the carcinogenic ones) and drugs, has already been done and reported by him. Few projects have been completed in this field.

However, much more work is required in this direction by covering more physiologically important organic compounds. Therefore, this work shall be continued to be undertaken during next five years.

3. Discipline: Analytical and Environment Chemistry:

Prof. R.D. Kaushik is carrying on research work in this field. 06 research students are enrolled for Ph.D. degree in the discipline. Few research projects have been completed. Studies related to the problem of pollution caused by cotton textile mills are being undertaken. In addition to it, the kinetic and other studies are being utilized for development of simpler, never and cost effective methods for the microgram/ nanogram estimations of hazardous aromatic amines as well trace metals in aqueous/ mixed media. An attempt is also being made for developing the methods for estimation of some important allopathic drugs in tablets as well as mixtures in the range varying between nanograms to milligrams. 01 more student is working in this direction and the work is at preliminary level. It will definitely find application in drug industries. The techniques being employed for this purpose are spectrophotometry, chromatography, spectroscopy and other general techniques. The systems discussed in the discipline number õ2ö are being used for this purpose. The work gains significance particularly because the finally developed methods are cost effective and involve the use of simple apparatuses and facilities available even at small laboratories in our country. Many research publications are to the credit of workers in this field. This work shall be carried forward in the next 5 years.

4. Discipline: Macrocyclic Chemistry and Electrochemistry.

The fact that Macrocyclic complexes are involved in a number of fundamental biological systems has long been recognized. The importance of such complexes, for example to the mechanism of photosynthesis or to the transport of oxygen in mammalian and other respiratory systems, has provided an impetus for investigation of the metal-ion chemistry of macrocyclic systems and these may be used a model for biological systems. Prof. Randhir Singh is involved in researches in this field. 12 students have been awarded Ph.D. in this discipline and 06 students are currently working in the same field. A number of publications related to the synthesis, spectral studies, electrochemical studies and analytical applications of these compounds have come out from the department in recent years. Synthesis of macrocyclic complexes of transition and post transition metal ions and structurally developed nano-macrocycles by using the template and nontemplate method, spectral studies (including the IR, electronic, ESR and NMR spectra), X-ray crystal structure determination, stereochemistry, electrochemical behaviour (including the cyclic voltammetric studies) and applications in selective solvent extraction of transition metal ions are being

undertaken for some of these compounds currently. This work shall be continued in next 5 years. In addition to it, the studies shall be extended and researches related to the chemical reactivity, catalytic effects, formation and dissociation studies, studies on dioxygen binding, studies on phosphate binding, stabilization of unusual oxidation states, redox reactions, thermodynamic studies, photochemical behaviour, transport across liquid membranes shall also be undertaken during the next 5 years.

The financial and other difficulties like unavailability of equipments, networking facilities, maintenance etc. are the only hindrances in the research work mentioned above. Department has the potential as well as the will to continue these researches. However, the aim is always maximum output by utilizing minimum finances and facilities. Still then, minimum facilities and infrastructure are always needed. More developed centers that are not showing good results are provided a handsome amount of grants and no one pays any heed to such compare atively smaller departments that can give large output. It is fine that DST has prepared the schemes like FIST and Department of Chemistry; Gurukul Kangri Vishwavidyalaya Haridwar has already been approved under this scheme and supported financially. However, we hope the department shall be selected by U.G.C. also for reasonable support in research

1. Psycho-Ayurvedic Diploma

It would be a new venture in the field of education as it would impart integrated training in the Psycho-Ayurvedic field. This is a job-orented course.

2. Post Graduate Diploma in Guidance and Counseling

There is an upcoming need for professional courses in the field of Psychology, as the traditional post graduate courses nuture theoretical understanding and so not equip te students for jobs in professional fields other than teaching.

The objective of the present course is to sensitize the students to the demands and pressures in different wakes of life and their consequences on an individual. Further specific skills required for guidance and counselling would be nutured so that the student can work as a guidance and counselling profession in various formal setting such as schools etc. or even start his own practice as a counsellor/guidance professional.

3. Psycho Diagnostic Clinic
Department of Psychology, Grukual Kangri Vishwavidyalaya, hereby proposes a diagnostic clinic in the department.

The aim of the clinic is to impart practical knowledge to the scholars of department and serving the community in the largely unattended field of mental health.

The objective of the project is quite clear firstly we think that the large amount of knowledge department possess in the field of psychology should reach common man directly and practically which will help him in more than one way. A part from psychological treatment the person will get enriched counselling for his complex life problems. Which in turn will bring hin in stte of Arogya and then the person will become a Asset for society and country.

Besides this the clinic will apart practical knowledge tofuture psychologists which produced by the University.
